Reagan Razon is a senior at Enloe High School in Raleigh, North Carolina. She is an Executive-At-Large of the Wake County Black Student Coalition which aims to end the criminalization of Black and brown students and educate the larger community about systemic issues. As an Executive, she has helped plan protests and community events and connected with school leaders, local activists, and media. She is an active member of her school's Black Student Union where she promotes Black student inclusion, and performs for the Black history month programs. Reagan has been dancing pre-professionally for over 12 years and has won multiple national competitions. While doing this, she advocated for young Black dancers through a virtual dancer series that she co-led. Reagan excels academically in STEM and with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, she has done research connecting the school-to-prison pipeline with various mathematical concepts. Through data visualization and science writing, Reagan explores the complexity of racism through an intersectional lens. She is also Vice President of Women In Science (WIS), which is a group aimed to bridge the gender and race gap by mentoring third grade girls in science. After high school, Reagan hopes to pursue Computer Science and explore the inequalities in computer algorithms.
